Dear Sir and Brother:

I am down here in Washington. I went from Chicago to Indianapolis for a few days and discussed matters connected with our organization with Secretary Hughes, and Brother Gillespie. I suggest that you write directly yourself to the hotel in Washington for your reservation for the Convention.

Request that they answer your letter, and then hold their answer and bring it with you when you are going to the Convention. There is undoubtedly going to be considerable confusion, and there will be some shortage of rooms, as the Congress will be still in session, as it appears now. When writing to the hotel state when you expect to get in; whether you expect to be alone, or whether you will be accompanied by some member of your family; also state what kind of room you want, whether a room with one bed or with twin beds. The General Executive Board will meet in the Mayflower Hotel at 10:00 a. a., Thursday, September 5, 1940.

Before you leave your district, endeavor to have cleared up any matters of importance, so that you will have freedom to act and think while at the Convention.
