Prior to becoming a librarian, Paola taught Italian at the University level for several years. She has a M.ED. in Foreign Language Education and has co-written a textbook on English as a Second Language. She has experience with instructional design and is an enthusiastic teacher.

Paola will be a member of the Education and Instruction Group and will be contributing to our new initiatives with the University Writing Program. She will also be working at the reference desk.
