Dear Sir and Brother:

This is to notify you that I am appointing you as a General Organizer for the International Brotherhood of Teamsters. You will begin work officially on July 1, 1944. If you are called to the office by Brother Flynn before July 1, your expenses will be paid. You can include those expenses in your July bill. Brother Flynn will give you some salary and expense blanks and will instruct you how to make them out.

As stated in my conversation with you here in the office, your salary will be five hundred dollars (\$500.00) a month, with the regular incidental expenses. Your hotel expenses, when you are out of the city and cannot return to your home at night, will be ten dollars (\$10.00) a day. Your incidental expenses will take care of local telephone calls and local bus or street car fare where the amount will be below twenty-five cents.

Your railroad fare will be paid for you when travelling from town to town in the interest of the organization. If you use your automobile to make a trip where you cannot make train connections conveniently, the railroad fare which it would have cost will be paid for the trip.

If there is any other information you desire, take the matter up with me or Brother Flynn and we will endeavor to explain.

You must remember always that you are now the representative of the International Union and the General President will be held responsible for your actions and your conduct. I have

great confidence that you will properly represent the International Union and the General President in whatever work you take up. Personally I feel that you have a great opportunity to serve the working people of America, and especially the membership of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters.

Of course you fully understand, as all organizers must understand, that your services, if unsatisfactory, can be dispensed with at any time. I might state, however, that we give every opportunity to an individual working for the International Union to prove his ability and worth.
