What the committee has indicated is that they are following their charge to try to eliminate any unnecessary words. Now, I think there is general agreement there is no substantive change. Inasmuch as the chairperson of that committee and other members are not here, several other members are not here, we can't resolve the committee's reaction to that.

However, I don't think we need to be delayed over this, what appears to me to be a rather minor change. Now, we may run into more trouble later on, but can we move beyond this?
