Dear Sir and Brother:

The undersigned organizations affiliated with Joint Council of Teamsters No. 7 respectfully request you to petition President Green and the Executive Council of the American Federation of Labor to assign competent person or persons to make a full and complete investigation of the Alameda Central Labor Council at Oakland, California.

We enumerate only a very few of the many reasons that we set forth as warranting such an investigation.

1. The interference by the Central Labor Council of the autonomous rights of local unions in respect to whether or not they can or should respect picket lines.
2. The unwarranted attack by the official organ of the Alameda Central Labor Council, "East Bay Labor Journal", on officers and representatives of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, and upon the local unions themselves to the detriment of the Labor Movement and our local unions in particular.
3. The deliberate interference by the Central Labor Council in the matter of a dispute involving jurisdiction between the Retail Clerks International Union and the International Brotherhood of Teamsters.
4. The refusal to give aid and assistance to one of our affiliated local unions (Warehouse Union Local 12) in its attempt to gain our rightful jurisdiction over warehousemen from the CIO.
5. General conduct of the Council and in particular its secretary, its legal counsel, and its editor; such conduct being in contradiction to the principles and precepts as enunciated by the American Federation of Labor. If such conduct be allowed to continue, the prestige of the Federation will suffer tremendously and the gains and benefits established by all of our American Federation of Labor unions will be endangered.

It is our solemn and sincere request that you, as our General President, make an urgent and immediate demand upon the officers of the American Federation of Labor to assign qualified investigators to look into this most serious situation at the earliest possible moment.
