Dear Sir and Brother:

I have your letter of April 21, 1947 wherein you state that our member in Laramie, Wyoming has contacted you and has requested that he be transferred to your local union and you have enclosed 25¢ for such transfer. Also you state that you have jurisdiction over Laramie, Wyoming.

There is quite a discrepancy between your story of Waggener and the one he tells his salesman here in Denver. According to Waggener, you have been harassing him about transferring into Local 307 and he does not want to transfer at all and there are enough good reasons why. First, your local does not have any agreement covering him and he also has a sick and death benefit in this local which he has paid for and which he would sacrifice if he were to transfer to Local 307.

As far as your claim to jurisdiction over Laramie, Wyoming, your charter was issued for Cheyenne and therefore you do not have any actual jurisdiction over Laramie, Wyoming.

Further, we would like to request that you transfer Mr. Alexander Brown back to Local 219 as you know he is a driver for the Rainbo Bread Company and lives in Greeley, Colorado and operates out of that city under our contract. This is also another member for whom you do not have a contract but he lives and works under our jurisdiction and contract.

I therefore am returning your 25¢ and enclosing 25¢ for the transfer of Alexander Brown.

I have talked to Paul Blinco, the International Representative, about this. Any further information you may desire, I would suggest you contact him.
