October 8, 1943	Robert L. Stine , born on this day. He is now a popular author of several scary books such as <i>Goosebumps</i> and <i>Fear Street</i> Series.
October 8, 1945	Felix Salten , the creator of <i>Bambi</i> , dies.
October 9, 1547	Bruce Catton , historian of the American Civil War, born in Petoskey, Michigan.
October 10, 1930	Playwright Harold Pinter born in London.
October 11, 1759	Parson (Mason Locke) Weems , born near Herring Bay, Maryland. Fictionalized the fifth edition of his biography of George Washington (1806) to make it more interesting. This created the cherry tree myth.
October 12, 1908	Ann Petry , African-American novelist, journalist, and biographer, born in Old Saybrook, Connecticut. She is the first African American writer to sell over a million copies.
October 13, 1890	Novelist Conrad Richter , born in Pine Grove, Pennsylvania.
October 14, 1822	Victor Hugo marries Adele Foucher at 20. His older brother Eugene suddenly goes insane at the wedding breakfast.
October 14, 1894	E.E. Cummings , born in Cambridge, Massachusetts.
