At its meeting of May 14, 1943, the Wage Adjustment Board considered its Case No. 652 involving a request from the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen and Helpers of America, Local Union No. 40, Mansfield, Ohio, for a breakdown in the Euclid drivers classification to apply on the Army Air Depot project at Shelby, Ohio.

The Board directed me to inform you that it unanimously decided that there is no ground for action by the Board in this case and that it is the function of the Davis-Bacon Section of the Department of Labor to determine what is a proper breakdown for Euclid drivers on the above referred to project.
