Dear Sir and Brother,

We of Local No. 965 request a definite understanding as to the status of our local.

Local No. 773 thru Joint Council No. 53 is now protesting the legality of our charter. We see no reason for the protest for the reason we went thru the proper channels to obtain same. Local No. 773 who is protesting our charter after five years of existence has only been able to sign up an estimated 30 members and we have signed up 72 paid up members also 150 pledges in the course of only two months of activity.

During the last two months while the protest is pending we have done no organizing, this has caused dissatisfaction amongst our members and pledges and thru this dissatisfaction the members are being solicited by the C I O which is very active in this section due to the Bethlehem Steel Co.

EMPLOYEES OF- One of the dairies which we have signed up in our local has refused an increase in pay providing they drop their union affiliations. These members who work at this dairy are subject to all kinds of jokes by the bosses thru this protest of Local No. 773.

Because of the circumstances that confronts us and because we don't want to see our organization go to the dogs we request the following.

- 1- Our right to affiliate with Joint Council No. 20.
- 2- The transfer of all dairy workers who are now members of Local No. 773 to our Local No. 965.
